6	Name of the action, 173 Wayne Avenue
7	Subdivision. SEQR status is unlisted.
8	Negative dec or I'm sorry, condition
9	negative declaration, answer is no.
10	Description of the action, it's a two
11	lot subdivision of an oversized lot
12	containing non-regulatory wetlands. The
13	location is southwest of the intersection of
14	Wayne Avenue and McCarthy Circle in the Town
15	of Stony Point. Tax map is designated
16	as Section 15.01 Block 4 Lot 57.
17	The reasons for supporting the
18	determination, the proposed action is not
19	anticipated to result in any adverse
20	environmental impacts based on the following.
21	On or about February 1, 2023, the Town
22	of Stony Point received an application for
23	site plan approval and supporting
24	documentation for the action described above.

Number 2, on or about April 17, 2024, a

2	short EAF Part 1 was submitted by the
3	applicant, and on or around June 27, 2024,
4	the Planning Board noticed its intent to
5	assume lead agency status and circulated
6	notice to the Stony Point Zoning Board of
7	Appeals, the Rockland County Highway
8	Department, and the Rockland County Planning
9	Department.
10	On or about August 22, 2024, having
11	received no objections, the Stony Point
12	Planning Board assumed lead agency status and
13	adopted a Part 2 short EAF, identifying the
14	following areas of potential environmental
15	impact.
16	A, potential impact to archaeological
17	resources. B, potential impact to on-site
18	wetlands. C, potential impact to northern
19	long eared bat.
20	Number 4, on or about December 12 on
21	or about October 24, 2024, the lead agency
22	reviewed and adopted a draft Part 3
23	environmental assessment form prepared by
24	Celentano Engineering, PLLC, dated and
25	revised September 23 of 2024, indicating the

## 1 Proceedings 2 following clarifications with regard to the 3 potential moderate or large environmental 4 impacts identified in the Part 2. 5 The New York State Department of Parks, 6 Recreation and Historic Preservation was 7 consulted on this SEOR review and has 8 recommended that historic and archaeological 9 resources will not be impacted. 10 Based on testimony by Peter Torgersen, 11 the wetland is small, isolated and typical to 12 this area of Stony Point due to the stony 13 hillside habitats in the area. This wetland 14 is not regulated by the New York State DEC or 15 the US Army Corps of Engineers. 16 C, the applicant has added notes to the 17 plan, restricting tree clearing on the site 18 to months when bats are not roosting. 19 And 5, no other adverse impacts were 20 identified. 21 Do I need to make a motion to accept 2.2 that again, correct? 23 BOARD MEMBER ROGERS: I'll make that 24 motion, Mr. Chairman. 25 BOARD MEMBER ALESSI: I'll second.

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
