Stony Point Ambulance Corps, Inc.—Serving Our Community Since 1946

For nearly 80 years, the **Stony Point Ambulance Corps** has been a volunteer-based service dedicated to providing prehospital emergency medical care and transportation across 31.6 square miles, including **Stony Point, Bear Mountain, and the Lake Welch** area.

With **approximately 140 members** across four sections, the Corps is a strong and active organization rooted in community service. Our **Board of Directors**, all local residents, oversee the budget and administration of the agency. The **Association** includes both



volunteers and paid staff who respond to emergency calls. We also have an **Auxiliary** for those who wish to support the Corps' mission in non-riding roles, and a **Youth Squad** for members aged 14–18. Youth who meet training requirements may begin riding as observers at age 15.

In 2024 alone, our members logged over 21,000 hours of response time and answered 1,700 calls for service. That number has grown by about 100 calls each year over the past five years, reflecting the increasing need for emergency medical support in our area.

In addition to emergency response, we're proud to offer a number of other community services:

- **Non-emergency transport** from hospitals to other healthcare facilities (when available)
- **Standby coverage** for local events like the Fall Festival, parades, and "Touch-a-Truck" days



- **Support for large public events**, such as bike races, marathons, triathlons, school events, and community drills
- **Loan Closet**—accepting donations of new or gently used walkers, wheelchairs, and canes, which are then made available to residents in need

We're proud to share that the Stony Point Ambulance Corps was recently honored as EMS Agency of the Year by both the NYS Volunteer Ambulance and Rescue Association and the Fire Association of New York State.

Additionally, one of our Youth Squad members received the prestigious Youth Member of the Year award from the NYSVARA.

We're always looking for new members! Whether you're interested in joining our emergency team, supporting behind the scenes, or exploring opportunities in our Youth Squad, we welcome you to be part of something meaningful. **Visit www.spacems.org to learn more and apply.** ■



Boat Launch Permits Required

A permit is required to use the boat launch at **Clark Park**. Permits must be purchased in advance at the **Town Clerk's office** (Monday-Friday, 8am-4:30pm) and cannot be purchased at the boat launch.

- **Resident Permits: \$35**—Proof of residency and boat registration required.

On February 28th, **Sgt. Mulligan** and **P.O. Horowitz** organized this year's Stony Point PBA Blood Drive in memory of **Jimmy McNicholas**. Originally started by **Sgt. Jay Wood** (Ret.), this event has now been running for 17 years. Thanks to their dedication, 47 pints of blood were collected this year, bringing the total to over 3,000 blood products donated over the years—making a lasting impact on many lives.

Introducing the Blue Envelope Program

The Stony Point Police Department, in collaboration with the RC Sheriff's Department, is participating in the Blue Envelope Program. This initiative is designed to assist individuals with autism during traffic stops. The blue envelope holds essential documents—driver's license, vehicle registration, and insurance card—and includes instructions for both the driver and the officer to ensure a smoother interaction.
